Key traits of CIO leadership

Exceptional Communicator Articulates a vision for strategic business value from IT and works across the organization to build partnership around this vision. Focuses communications on value and innovation, not technology. Helps all IT staff to understand the business and speak the language of business leaders.

Recognized IT Leader ("Cheap Information Officer") Clearly demonstrates value-formoney in the management of core IT services – providing the right services at the right price and the right level of quality. Recognized among peers as an effective leader of the IT unit.

Driver of Business Value ("Chief Improvement Officer") Understands the business and needs of the CEO, CFO, Line-of-Business heads and other senior executives. Ensures clear focus on potential and realized value in all IT initiatives. Incorporates IT into business decision-making by participating in key strategic conversations, suggesting innovative uses of IT, and managing risk.

Trusted Partner ("CIO-Plus")Exercises authority beyond IT itself. Considered a trusted member of the senior executive team, not just a technology leader. Suggests innovative uses of IT to transform the business- and successfully executes the changes. May receive additional non-IT responsibilities such as Chief Operating Officer or VP of Strategy, or strategic temporary roles such as Head of M&A integration.

APPLICATION PROCESS

Nomination

If the key traits describe you or a CIO you know, begin the process by visiting the MIT Sloan CIO Symposium website at www.mitcio.com/award. The application is brief and is designed to allow candidates to tell their innovation story in their own words. Application Deadline is March 1, 2022.

The Questions

Question 1

a) Please describe your company, IT organization, and your role. (100 words) b) What role/title does the CIO report to? (25 words) c) Describe any organizational responsibilities outside of IT. (50 words) What title (or unit) is responsible for leading digital transformation in your company? What role does IT play? (50 words)

Question 2

How have you improved the capability of IT to deliver the right services at the right price and the right level of quality? How do you demonstrate this performance to the rest of the business? (150 words)

Question 3

How have you fostered a culture in the business that consistently generates new value from IT? How do you prioritize funding and drive accountability for results? Please describe the "before" and "after." (300 words)

Question 4

Describe an innovation that illustrates your vision and achieved your targeted business results. Why do you consider this initiative to be innovative? How did you select, design, build support for and manage the execution of this innovation? (400 words)

Question 5

What results did this innovation deliver? How did you assure that these results would continue to be delivered? Please include both hard and soft metrics. (200 words)

Question 6

Even in the most effective organizations, not all initiatives will be successful. What is an initiative that you directly sponsored that was not successful? What were the most important lessons learned from that experience? (200 words)

Question 7

What is the greatest challenge you and your organization still need to address in driving strategic value from IT and digital? (200 words)

Selection Process

A panel of CIOs, industry thought leaders and MIT Sloan-affiliated professionals will act as judges. The judges will evaluate each application, based on the quality of the innovation and the leadership characteristics of the applicant. Finalists will be notified in late April.

All Award recipients will be formally recognized at an exclusive dinner for in-person attendees of the MIT Sloan CIO Symposium on May 22, 2022.
